






# Year 3/4: Textiles-2D shape to 3D project

Subject Specific Vocabulary		Prior Learning Y1/2	Sticky Knowledge
		<p>Have joined fabric in simple ways by gluing and stitching. Have used simple patterns and templates for marking out. Have evaluated a range of textile products.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Layer fabrics so they can be strengthened, stiffened and reinforced to make a product fit for purpose.</li> <li>Start and finish sewing properly to produce a secure join between two pieces of fabric.</li> <li>Understand the need for patterns and seam allowances to produce a product of a specific size that doesn't fray.</li> <li>Know and use technical vocabulary relevant to the designing, making and evaluation of their project.</li> </ul>
		<p><b>Future Learning Y5/6</b></p> <p>Will learn that a 3-D textile product can be made from a combination of accurately made pattern pieces, fabric shapes and different fabrics. Will learn that fabrics can be strengthened, stiffened and reinforced where appropriate.</p>	
<b>aesthetics</b>	the way in which the product looks with the nature and expression of beauty.	 	
<b>appliqué</b>	means 'applied' - describes method of stitching/gluing patches onto fabric to provide decoration.		
<b>pattern</b>	a shape drawn to exact shape and size and used to assist cutting out.		
<b>prototype</b>	a model that is made to test whether a design will work.		
<b>seam</b>	a line of stitching that joins pieces of fabrics together.		
<b>seam allowance</b>	extra fabric allowed for joining together - usually 1.5cm.		
		<p><b>Decorative Techniques</b></p>  <p>Embroidery stitches e.g. cross-stitch</p>  <p>Appliqué by gluing or stitching</p>
