print	An art print is a printed reproduction of an original work of art.
styrofoam	Material used to imprint a design.
imprint	To make a mark or design into a surface.
pattern	A repeated decorative design.
motif	A decorative image or design, especially a repeated one forming a pattern.
roller	Tool used to apply ink to a printing block.
ink	Paint like substance used to add colour to prints.
repeat	To copy a motif or pattern more than once.
overlay	To overlay is to cover with a coating or a layer, or to set one thing on top of another.

- Use relief or impressed method
- Create prints with three overlays
- Work into prints with a range of media e.g. pens, colour pens and paints
